



Help Us Remove Barriers for STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

The Disability Resources Testing Center administers exams for currently affiliated students with disabilities that require exam accommodations due to a disability need. The Testing Center only administers exams for Texas A&M University courses and program requirements.

The Testing Center has four group testing rooms with individual cubicles for seating to provide a reduced distraction testing environment. Two rooms have 25 seats and two rooms have 15 seats. One of the 15-seat rooms is primarily used for computer-based testing. There are also 15 individual exam rooms for use by students who use specialized software or hardware, a reader or scribe, or need a private room. All rooms have several adjustable tables and the individual rooms have different light options and all spaces are wheelchair accessible.

Our Mission

Disability Resources staff members interact and collaborate with faculty, staff, and students to achieve an equitable learning environment for students with disabilities at Texas A&M University.

A campus community in which students with disabilities are equal members without barriers.

Exam Accommodations

Some examples of exam accommodations based on disability need, may include but are not limited to:

- Extended testing time
- Reduced distraction environment
- Large print
- Braille or e-text formatted version of the exam
- Exam scribe
- Exam reader or use of text-to-speech software
- Use of adaptive software (ZoomText, JAWS, Read & Write, Dragon, NaturallySpeaking)
- Use of adaptive hardware (video magnifier, adaptive mice, keyboards, etc.)
