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
A MESSAGE FROM THE VICE PRESIDENT FOR STUDENT AFFAIRS

As one of the world's leading research institutions, Texas A&M is at the forefront in making significant contributions to scholarship and discovery, including that of science and technology. Research conducted at Texas A&M represented annual expenditures of more than \$922 million in fiscal year 2018. Texas A&M ranked in the top 20 of the National Science Foundation's Higher Education Research and Development survey (2017), based on expenditures of more than \$905.4 million in fiscal year 2017. Texas A&M's research creates new knowledge that provides basic, fundamental and applied contributions resulting, in many cases, in economic benefits to the state, nation and world.

BRYAN / COLLEGE STATION, TEXAS

The Bryan-College Station area offers residents a high quality of life, despite being one of the fastest-growing areas in Texas. Our twin cities offer the feel of small-town life with the convenience and variety of suburban shopping, dining and entertainment.

The Northgate District in College Station includes entertainment and shopping close to campus, and Century Square which features restaurants and bars, shops, a movie theater, two hotels, and an entertainment venue. Originally a railroad town, downtown Bryan has distinguished itself as a unique destination for arts and culture. Eclectic restaurants, shops, and art galleries foster a funky, smalltown charm.

MSC OPAS, part of the Division of Student Affairs at Texas A&M, hosts professional productions of theater, music, and dance programs throughout the fall and spring semesters, and our own Department of Music Activities features performances for the campus and community by student choral groups, bands, orchestras, and jazz ensembles. Our University Art Galleries provide a variety of opportunities to experience art exhibits, events, handson art activities, and lectures on campus.

The Brazos Valley Symphony Orchestra performs throughout the year, and special events such as Brazos Valley Worldfest, Wiener Fest, and the Texas Reds Steak and Grape Festival are favorites among locals.

When you're ready to head outdoors, more than 100 local parks feature walking and biking trails, playgrounds, and event venues, and several state parks and national forests are within a two- or three-hour drive.

The local economy has continued to expand since 2010 and is performing among the best in the state. Both the Bryan Independent School District and College Station Independent School District are recognized for providing an exceptional education. In addition, our area has many well-regarded private schools.






Cadet Life

POSITION OVERVIEW

The Commandant is responsible for reporting to the Vice President for Student Affairs and is charged with overseeing the operation and administration of the Corps of Cadets program at Texas A&M University and all activities and functions of the Corps of Cadets (including the Aggie Band). This oversight encompasses academics, training, leadership development, discipline, career readiness, and housing. The Commandant serves as Head of the School of Military Sciences, and liaison for academic matters between the university and the three ROTC departments.

Key Responsibilities

- Manage, coordinate, and supervise the organization, academic success, training, leader development, discipline, career readiness, housing, and daily activities of the Corps of Cadets. Establish, monitor, and enforce standards, policies, and procedures regarding cadet performance and conduct. Within jurisdictional bounds, investigate and adjudicate cases involving a breach of the Cadet Standard and/or University Student Rules. As appropriate, refer cases to the Title IX Coordinator or the Student Conduct Office.
- Serve as a visible role model and mentor for cadets. Develop, review and update the Corps of Cadets Strategic Plan and resource programmatic activities in support of the Strategic Plan. Communicate the importance of these programs to relevant university constituencies.
- Maintain collaborative relationships throughout the university, especially those based on academics (Deans, faculty, academic advisors) and parallel responsibilities within the Division of Student Affairs. Work collaboratively with the Director of Residence Life in assuring cadet compliance with university student housing rules and policies, and in coordinating the management of the student-housing program for cadets. Coordinate the efforts of the President's Board of Visitors (BOV) in advising the Commandant and the Commandant's staff with the Vice President for Student Affairs. Establish and maintain a working relationship with the Corps of Cadets Association (CCA), The Association of Former Students (AFS), the Texas A&M Foundation, and the 12th Man Foundation. Serve on various university committees. Act as liaison to the Faculty Senate and the Academic Operations Committee (AOC). Promote and support recruiting initiatives of the Corps of Cadets and the ROTC departments at Texas A&M. Attend and participate in other activities and programs of the University as the principal representative of the Corps of Cadets.
- Recommend service nominations for Professor of Naval Science, Professor of Aerospace Studies, and Professor of Military Science. Approve all other service nominations for ROTC positions at Texas A&M.
- Respond to cadets, parents, former students, faculty, staff, and others on questions concerning policies, disciplinary actions, academic performance, and all programs and activities of the Corps of Cadets.
- Support and assist Development Officers, the BOV, and CCA in raising funds for priorities within the Corps of Cadets. Prepare and monitor the budget for the Office of the Commandant, including all relevant funds at the university and Texas A&M Foundation.
